Step 1: Browsing and finding resources in the catalogue

There are lots of different ways to discover and find resources in our catalogue. When you visit the catalogue area of our website you will notice that all agreements can be found in one place. You can combine any of the following filters to expand or refine your search :

- Find all resources
- Filter free of charge resources
- NESLi2 offers
- Filter by subject area
- Filter by academic level
- Filter by resource type
- Search by resource name
- Including expired agreements

Whichever method you choose the search results are always displayed in alphabetical order.

1. Find all resources

When you visit the Catalogue area of our website, the full list of resources are displayed by default. The filter “Showing **All**” is displayed in bold. Please see the example screenshot below.

4. Filter by subject area

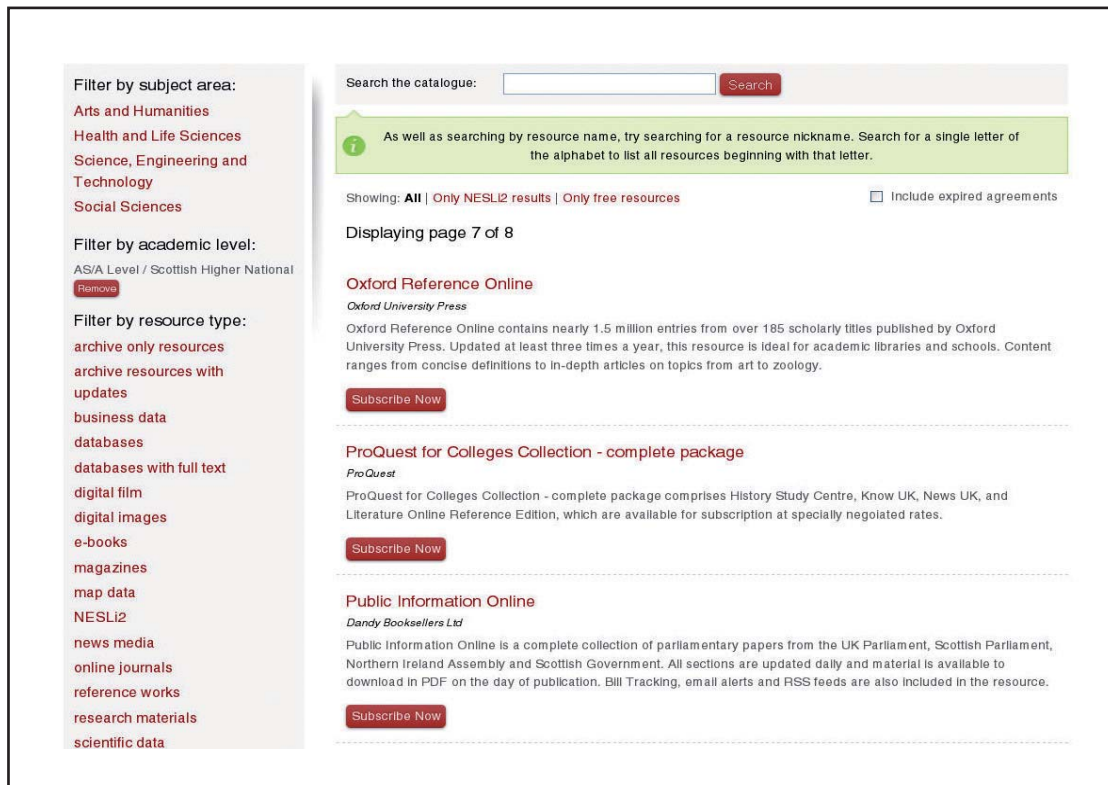
You can filter the list of resources by clicking on any of the four main subject area links on the left under the “Filter by subject area category” area. When you select a subject area (only one subject area can be selected at any one time), it is displayed in grey along with a red button to remove the selected subject area filter if you wish. Please see the screenshot below where the “Social Sciences” subject filter has been selected. The resources which either have an annual subscription fee, annual access fee, or one-off fee are displayed in red. A free of charge resource and a NESLi2 SMP offer is displayed in the example below. Clicking on any of the resource titles will provide you with further information on that resource. A shortcut to subscribe to the resources in the list is provided for each resource (except for expired agreements). Each resource always has a short overview description and the name of the publisher is displayed for each resource by default. Current agreements are also displayed in the catalogue by default unless you also check the “Include expired agreements” filter as well.

If a resource is free of charge then the pricing will not be displayed to the user (whether they are logged in to the site or not) as there is no cost to the institution. If you are logged into the site you can request a free trial to any resource for which free trials are available - simply click on the "Apply for a free trial" button and you will receive an acknowledgment email for the request and your trial request is automatically forwarded onto the respective publisher.

If you are not logged in to the site and you view a NESLi2 offer, the only tab you will see is the Overview tab. You have to log in to view the offer details. If you are logged into the site and you either try to subscribe or view the Pricing and Subscription information tab for a resource that is not licensed for your institution you will see a message stating that the agreement is not open to your sector (each Membership Account for an institution is assigned to a particular sector and JISC Band).
