The JISC Collections UK National Academic Archive includes an expanding range of specially selected archive resources which are available in perpetuity to UK Higher and Further Education institutions, and Research Councils.

This important programme is part of JISC Collections' ongoing commitment to widening access to essential material across the subject spectrum.

Access for all...

The cost of acquiring archive resources is beyond the means of the majority of institutions. JISC Collections' purchasing role at a national level makes it possible for *all* institutions to provide access to a wealth of high quality online resources – and over 250 are already taking advantage of the agreements negotiated.

Over £7 million in annual efficiency gains...

Agreements for the resources available within the **UK National Academic Archive** currently deliver over £7 million in annual efficiency gains to the community. Efficiency gains for resources purchased in 2007/8 amount to over £1 million.

Wide-ranging content...

The **UK National Academic Archive** offers unrivalled online access to a vast range of journals, historical map data, newspapers, periodicals, and books published between 1473 and 2006.

Broad subject coverage...

Invaluable resources for the arts and humanities, health and life sciences, social sciences, science, engineering and technology, business, law, and medicine are available within the **UK National Academic Archive**.

Unlimited user access – anytime, anywhere...

Many of the original works included in the archive resources are very rare and/or fragile. However, an unlimited number of users at institutions across the UK can now access these essential materials, alongside a range of other resources, simultaneously – from wherever they are, and 24/7.

American Chemical Society Legacy Archives



Access to over 464,000 articles from 22 journals published between 1879 and 1995. Titles include some of the most highly-cited journals in the field, such as *Chemical Reviews*, the *Journal of the American Chemical Society*, and the *Journal of Organic Chemistry*.

New!

Brill Journal Archive Online

Includes over 50,000 articles from more than 80 journals published before 2000. Subjects covered include biology, humanities, human rights, international law, science, and the social sciences. Titles include one of the world's oldest academic journals on Chinese studies, *T'oung Pao*.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, and access via the publisher's server is FREE until 31/5/2013. An access fee may apply after this date, but institutions can choose to self-host the content for a one-off fee of €199 + VAT.

British and Irish Legal Information Institute (BAILII) Open Law Project



Following funding from JISC, thousands of core historical legal judgements and law reports relating to Britain and Ireland have been digitised, and are now freely available and cross searchable on the BAILII website at www.bailii.org.

Early English Books Online – Text Creation Partnership

22.5 million pages from more than 125,000 books have been digitised to create an extraordinary record of the English-speaking world from 1473 to 1700. The resource is being further enhanced through the JISC-funded Text Creation Project which is re-keying 20% of the titles in the collection to make them fully searchable for the first time.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, but a fee applies for access via the publisher's server.

Eighteenth Century Collections Online

Over 135,000 books and editions published between 1800 and 1900 have been digitised and are now fully cross-searchable online.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, but a fee applies for access via the publisher's server.

Historic Digimap

Access to historical Ordnance Survey maps covering Great Britain from 1843 to 1995. The maps can be viewed on screen, printed at a range of scales, and downloaded for use with application software such as GIS and CAD.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, but a fee applies for access via the Digimap platform.

House of Commons Parliamentary Papers



Over 300 years of official parliamentary records can now be cross-searched on a single platform:

- **Eighteenth Century Parliamentary Papers** – over 1,400 volumes and 0.5 million pages of documents going back to 1688.
- **Nineteenth Century House of Commons Parliamentary Papers** – over 6,000 volumes and 4 million pages of documents.

New!

- **Twentieth Century House of Commons Parliamentary Papers** – filmed images of over 100,000 papers and 5.2 million pages of documents going up to 2004.

Institution of Civil Engineers Virtual Library Archive

Access to the full text of every paper published by the Institution of Civil Engineers between 1836 and 2001, representing over 200,000 pages of information.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, and access via the publisher's server is FREE until 31/12/2013. An access fee may apply after this date, but institutions can choose to locally load the content for a one-off fee of £500 +VAT.

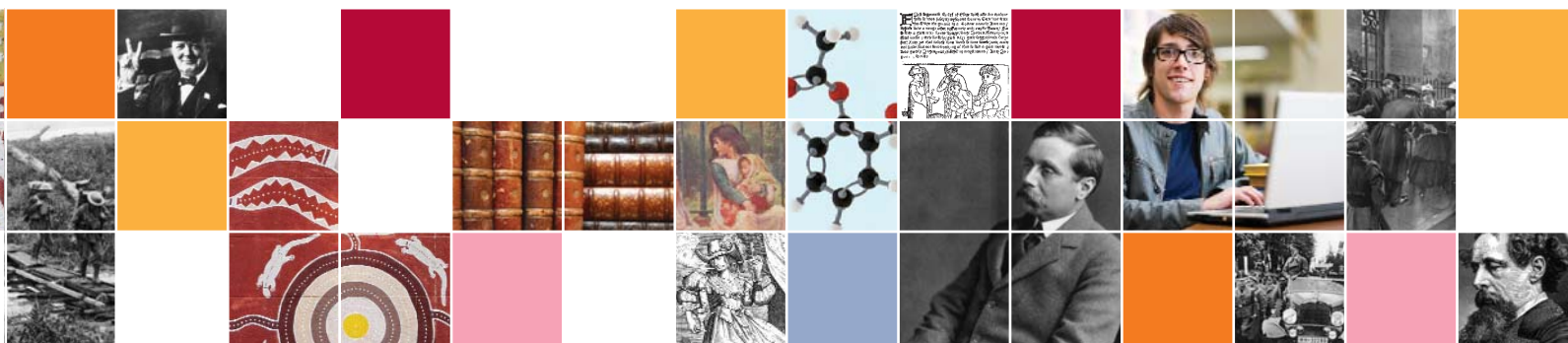

Internet Archaeology Archive

Access to issues 1-12 of the pioneering e-only journal *Internet Archaeology*, published between 1996 and 2006. Includes full colour images, video footage, virtual reality models, searchable datasets, and interactive mapping.



IOP Journal Archive

Includes over 140,000 articles from 40 journals published by the Institute of Physics between 1874 and 1998, and covering the most significant developments in the history of physics.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, and access via the publisher's server is FREE until 31/12/2009. An access fee may apply after this date, but institutions can choose to locally load the content free of charge.

Nineteenth Century British Library Newspapers

As part of the £22 million JISC Digitisation Programme, almost 1 million pages from the British Library's unique collection of nineteenth century national and regional newspapers are now cross searchable online.



New! Nineteenth Century UK Periodicals Online, Series 1

Access to the full text of 100 titles and 1.2 million pages from periodicals (for women and children, and those focusing on humour and sport) published in the UK between 1800 and 1900. Also offers an extensive library of newly captured images, including approximately 8,000 in colour.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, but a fee applies for access via the publisher's server.

Oxford Journals Archive

Contains over 3 million articles from more than 140 journals published by Oxford University Press between 1849 and 1995. Subject coverage is broad – from the humanities and social sciences to science, medicine, and law.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, and access via the publisher's server is FREE until 31/07/2011. An access fee may apply after this date, but institutions can choose to locally load the content for a one-off fee of £500 + VAT.

Periodicals Archive Online: JISC Collections Selection

Access to over 288,000 articles from 80 journals published between 1891 and 2000 and spanning a wide range of disciplines in the arts, humanities, and social sciences. Titles include the *British Journal of Psychology*, *History Today*, *Literary Review*, *Foreign Affairs*, and the *Sloan Management Review*.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, and access via the publisher's server is FREE until 31/5/2013. An access fee may apply after this date, but institutions can choose to self-host the content for a one-off fee of £500 + VAT.

Royal Society of Chemistry Journals Archive

Includes over 238,000 original articles published by the Royal Society of Chemistry, and its forerunner societies, between 1841 and 2004.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity on behalf of institutions but a fee applies for access via the publisher's server for institutions that do not subscribe to the RSC's NESLI2 agreement. Institutions can choose to self-host the content for a one-off fee of £50 + VAT.

Taylor & Francis Geography, Planning, Urban & Environment Online Archive

Access to over 20,000 articles from 28 journals from their first imprint until 1994. Titles include *European Planning Studies*, the *Journal of Architecture*, and the *Journal of Environmental Planning and Management*.

The content has been purchased in perpetuity, and access via the publisher's server is FREE until 30/6/2013. An access fee may apply after this date.

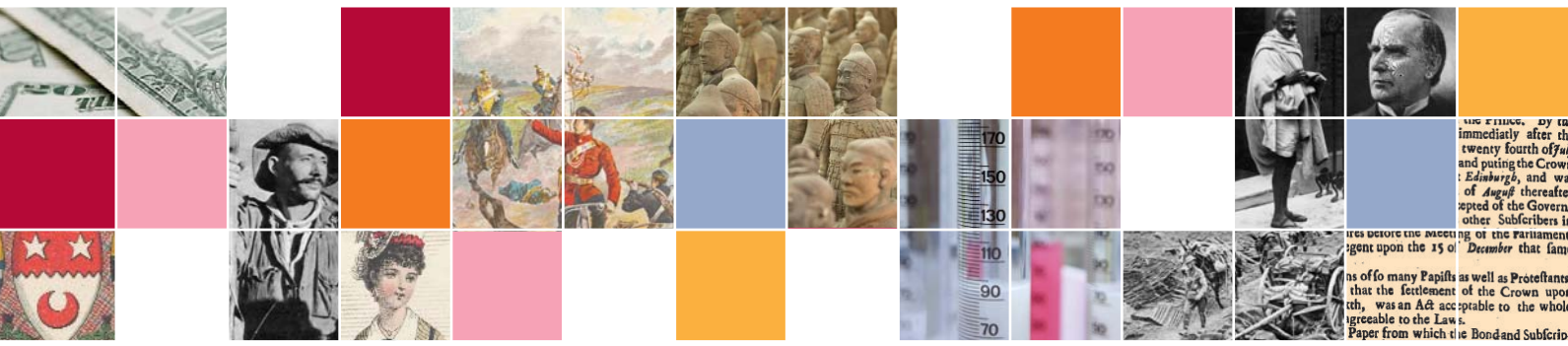

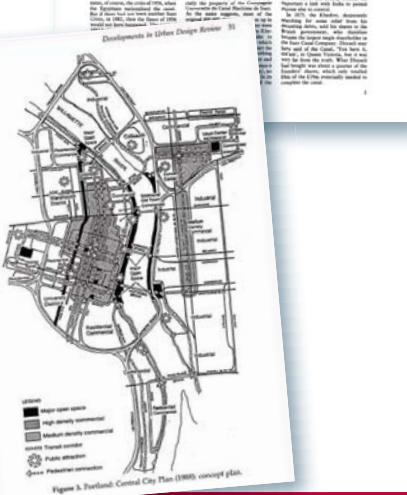

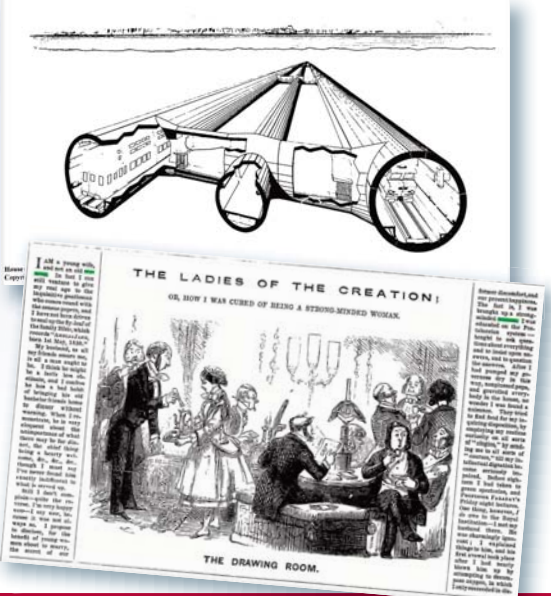


How were the resources selected?

The journal archive purchases followed an open and transparent procurement process.

JISC Collections issued an invitation to tender in 2007. Responses were marked and ranked by an expert panels of volunteers from the JISC Working Groups according to quality, value for money, and willingness of the publisher to meet the user needs of the academic community.

The *Nineteenth Century UK Periodicals Online, Series 1* and the *Twentieth Century House of Commons Parliamentary Papers* were purchased in response to demand from institutions, and to complement existing collections.





About JISC Collections

JISC Collections was established by the UK Higher and Further Education funding councils in 2006 to negotiate at a national level with publishers and owners of digital content on behalf of the academic and research community.

Originally operating within the Joint Information Systems Committee (JISC), **JISC Collections** is now a limited company that mutually trades with its members - all Higher and Further Education institutions, and Research Councils, that receive direct funding from the UK Higher and Further Education funding councils.

A JISC-funded service, **JISC Collections** also provides a service for an expanding range of affiliate members – organisations in the UK and overseas which qualify for membership through their engagement in life-long learning, for example schools and museums.

Run by the academic community on behalf of the academic community...

JISC Collections is run on a day-to-day basis by a senior management team, overseen by an elected Board of Directors which includes senior members of the academic community. The Board provides JISC Collections with governance, its strategic direction, as well as controlling and reviewing business performance.

JISC Collections is chaired by David House, Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the University of Brighton. The Executive is led by Lorraine Estelle, CEO, and is supported by a team of information professionals.

Five Working Groups support **JISC Collections** in identifying and acquiring online resources. The Working Groups are made up of representatives from the Further and Higher Education community, and Research Councils.
